

Year 5 had an exciting Anglo-Saxon day!





- Hair accessories Small bows/clips/bobbles may be worn in red, black, or white


Please ensure that all clothing is clearly named, including shoes and pumps.



We have also enjoyed learning about how to draw faces, about our bodies and the five senses. We have talked about how to keep our teeth healthy and talked a lot about our families. We have also been lucky enough to have a visit from Mrs Ambler, who talked to us about road safety and people who help us.

In English we have loved our class stories. Firstly, we read 'This is the Bear'. We enjoyed reading about the bear and the mischievous dog and wrote some fabulous descriptive sentences about them. We then moved onto Poetry. We went on a lovely autumn walk and were really inspired by the beautiful nature around us. We used our senses to help us generate words to help us describe what we saw, felt, and could smell.



In Maths we have been learning all about place value and we have been busy finding 1 more and 1 less, ordering numbers and comparing numbers. We have also started our learning on addition and have been practising our recall of number bonds to ten



In PSHE our topic has been 'Me and My Relationships.' We have been thinking all about our feelings and how we can make things better when we feel upset. We wrote some fantastic 'Recipes for Friendship' to help share our ideas on what it means to be a good friend.

Year One Autumn One

It has been a wonderful First half Term and we are really pleased with how well the children have settled into Year One. We have really enjoyed our topics this half term and have loved our little walks, visitors and workshops that have helped making our learning even more fun and exciting!



In Science we have been learning about everyday materials including wood, plastic, glass and paper. We have explored the properties of these everyday materials and enjoyed finding out why they are used for making certain objects

We carried out some simple investigations to help us find out why some materials are best suited to things than others e.g a paper towel is much better at mopping up a spill than tin foil!

We have had so much fun in History exploring toys. Our highlight has to be our amazing toy workshop where the children delighted in playing with old toys and learning all



In RE we have been exploring 'Belonging' we know that we belong to so many different groups. We have taken a closer look at how Christians welcome a new baby into the world, and we have compared this to a Muslim naming ceremony.



In PE we have been working on agility and coordination We have been trying to steady our balance on one leg and have worked up to including a one leg squat and extension. The children had some great techniques for



In our Art sessions we have been looking at line drawings in pencil. We have explored different types of lines and have applied different amounts of pressure to our pencil to see what results it brings. We then used this knowledge to create some fabulous animal line drawings.

Well done Year 2! What a great start to the year you have made. You are growing into fantastic learners, showing perseverance, determination, taking on board



In history we loved our topic 'Toffee Town'. We have learnt why John and Violet Mackintosh were so significant. How their business began, the types of sweets they made and how he became so successful. We used old photos to explore how Halifax has changed,

noticing how many chimneys there were, and how much smoke was polluting the environment.

In Art we looked at figures and portraits. We learnt how to create different tones using pencil and charcoal before creating a piece that demonstrated all the skills we had

In English we have shared the book In the Deep Dark Wood. The children have been so inspired, creating setting and character descriptions.

They will then use the story structure to inspire their own story writing. Their focus in their writing has been to include adjectives and

extend their sentences using conjunctions such as 'and' and 'because'.



In maths we have been learning about Place Value. We have been partitioning numbers to 100 into 10s and 1s. We have also been representing numbers in different ways as well as ordering and comparing them.

In addition and subtraction, we have practised our number bonds and created fact families.

In RE we have been learning about places that are sacred to believers. We learned about churches, mosques and synagogues. We will conclude our learning with some lessons about Diwali.

In Science we have been focussing on states of matter! We were fascinated to find out about the properties of solids, liquids and gases and how these changes can be reversible and irreversible. Our favourite lesson took a whole day to complete as we had to observe how a frozen hand changes state due to time and temperature. This was so fun to watch!

We have also been using our rocket words to describe differen states of matter and could not believe the melting point of different metals!

Year 4

Class on a Page - Autumn 1

This half term we have explored two fantastic books, The Lost Words and Queen of Darkness. This has inspired us to create amazing acrostic poems and sensational setting descriptions of a Roman battle! We have also loved reading our work to different audiences in school.

In Maths this half term we have focussed on place value and addition and subtraction. We have used concrete, pictorial and abstract methods to explore how to identify, count and reason with numbers up to 10.000! We have also worked hard to improve our multiplication confidence.







This half term in History we have been exploring the Romans and their impact on modern civilisation. We have used research, historical enquiry, and artefacts to dive into the changes that happened when the Romans invaded Britannia, and how life changed for the people that were settled there. We have researched Roman roads, Hadrian's wall, the role of the Roman Empire, what life was like in Rome and learned about the colosseum and the gladiators that fought there! We loved creating our own gladiators and reenacting a Roman invasion!

In Art we have been exploring the work of Bridget Riley. She uses lines, tones and colour to create patterns in her art work. We have loved recreating this art and planning and creating our own interpretations. We can't wait to show you our books at the next 'Open classroom' event!

In RE we have been looking at the Gospel and the special events in Jesus' life. We have shown respect and developed our understanding of the role of a disciple. We also loved visiting Rev Jen at church to find out the meaning behind the story of the 10 lepers.

Is the creation story in conflict with scientific theories or complementary? This has been our challenging yet interesting topic in RE this half term. We have delved into what different groups of Christians interpret the Creation story as, and how it merges or disagrees with scientific theories of the creation of the world.

WE have LOVED our history topic this half term: The Vikings! We have added to our already extensive knowledge of the Vikings—learning all about where they came from and settled, who king Ethelred was, their beliefs, physicality and how they travelled!



We have hit the ground running with maths so far in Year 6! Covering our place value topic, where we learnt to round numbers up to the nearest million and recognise negative numbers; to the Four Operations. We have looked at column method for addition and subtraction as well as solving multi-step problems. We have also just learnt some tricky methods for solving multiplication and division including long and short division!



Year 6 have shown what AMAZING writers they are already this half term, writing some wonderfully creative free verse poems based off the book: The Lost Words. We then looked at writing persuasive texts as different characters from Matilda! We had lots of fun pretending to be Miss Trunchbull! We have recently wrote informative newspaper reports linked to Black History Month and inspirational black women throughout history.
