



Year 1 In Science we have been learning about plants – we have planted our own sunflower seeds; we wonder whether they will grow nice and tall!



Advice for parents and carers

Games consoles



Top tips:



Talk with your child about responsible use of their games console

Discuss what is okay and not okay to use it for and look at the possible risks. Tell your child what they should do if something goes wrong while using it. This could be to turn off the screen and tell an adult.



Think about the location of the games console

Will it be in a shared family space or in a bedroom? Think about: setting time limits; reminding your child about the risks of communicating online with people that they do not know; and encouraging them to come to you with any worries.



Explore parental controls

Take a look at the controls available both on the games console itself and on your home Wi-Fi. Talk these through with your child too. Parental controls are a helpful tool, but an open conversation with your child is the most important thing.

SCHOOL UNIFORM


Don't forget we have our free pre-loved uniform shop at the school office! You can get free items anytime the office is open and drop off items which still have life in them to share with other families.

- Grey trousers, skirt, or shorts
- White shirt/blouse or polo shirt
- Red sweatshirt, jumper, or cardigan (preferably with a school logo)
- During summer months a red gingham dress/skirt or cullottes may be worn
- Suitable black school shoes (which can be easily fastened for Reception class children). Ankle boots can be worn. NO TRAINERS
- Gym kit Red polo shirt, navy shorts; black pumps; drawstring bag
- Outdoor (preferably waterproof) coat, wellington boots etc
- Jewellery is not permitted in school. Sleepers or small studs may be worn in pierced ears except on PE days, when they must be removed by the parent. The school does not accept responsibility for any lost or broken items

- Hair should be a natural colour only.


Please ensure that all clothing is clearly named, including shoes and pumps.



Understanding the world has been a focus again this half term. We have looked more closely at the statements around learning about the past. As part of this the children really enjoyed finding out about the homes they live in now and those in the past. We used the book 'Peepo' to support us with this.

We then moved on to learning about Castles which has proved very popular – as you can imagine! The children have learnt so much about when and why castles we built and also the different features of a castle.

Reception – Spring 2 *'Once Upon a Time'*

This term we have been spent lots of time reading the traditional tale 'The Three Little Pigs'. We have used this as a stimulus to help with our retelling, creativity and to make links to the past.

The children have been amazing and have produced some really wonderful work!

We had an amazing World Book Day! It was a fun packed day with the Book Café, Book Club and the wonderful parade in church. The children really did look wonderful in their costumes – thank you so

much for supporting us with this.

In PSHE/circle time our activities have centered around the idea of Rights and Respect. We have undertaken drama activities where the children have acted out scenarios and then we have talked about how we can help and care for people at home and at school.

Our texts this half term have been the traditional tales 'The Three Little Pigs' and 'Mr Wolf's Pancakes!'. The children have really enjoyed learning the stories and the different ways that they can retell them – our story telling table has been a hive of activity!

In Maths, we have looked at the numbers 6-8. We have secured our understanding of those numbers and their composition. We have also looked at combining groups

as the basic steps towards addition and

deciding whether they are odd or even.

Alongside this, we have also looked at length, height and elements of time.

Our phonics teaching has focused on recapping our digraphs and trigraphs and consolidating our learning. They are now more secure with blending longer words that they read and recognising the

Our focus now is on writing and encouraging the children to segment all of the sounds in a word and write sentences independently.

tricky words.



Easter has been the main focus of our RE unit this half term. We have learnt about the Easter story and the significance of the symbol of the cross in the Christian religion. We have also talked about saying sorry and forgiving one another as well as showing love and care for each other. We read and retold the story of the Good Samaritan.









Year 1 Spring 2

Our Local Area

It has been a wonderful 2nd half of our Spring Term with so many amazing learning opportunities for the children.

In English we have been looking at Non-fiction books — in particular the features and structure and using these to help us find information about animals. We have also been looking at labels, lists, and captions. We know how useful these can be to help you organise and record information in different ways.

In Maths we have been learning all about place value and we have been busy finding 1 more and 1 less, ordering numbers and comparing numbers. We have also started our learning on addition.



In PSHE we have looked at what it means to respect someone or something.

In Science we have been learning about Plants. We have looked at the different parts of a plant and what a plant needs to help it to grow. We planted our own seeds and watched them develop. We also enjoyed researching and finding out about different garden and wildflowers.





We have had so much fun in Geography exploring our topic 'Our Local Area'. We enjoyed discovering the human and physical features of our local area and deciding as a class whether we can improve things and create more opportunities.

In PE we have been learning about Dance.
We have travelled in different ways,
explored balance, posture and timing.

In RE we have been exploring ourselves and the importance of taking care of the World we live in.
We have looked at some key Bible stories linked to this e.g. The Good Samaritan and discussed the big and little things we can do to protect and care for our environment and those who live in it.



In DT we have enjoyed making mechanical pictures with sliders and pivots. We needed to carefully cut lines so that our features could move.

Year 2

In RE we have learning why Easter matters to Christians. We have been exploring and ordering the Easter story, and thinking about the sacrifice Jesus made for his followers. We learned that Christians believe Jesus died to take away the sins of his helicage.



In maths we have learnt about multiplication and division. Understanding that division can include grouping and sharing, using concrete resources and pictorial representations.

Spring 2







In English we shared the story of 'Man on the Moon' The children have written a postcard from space as well as retell the story from the alien's perspective.

In PE we have been completing our Dance unit. We have been learning how to move rhythmically to music – solo and





In Geography we have learnt about 3 famous explorers. Do you recognise them?
We explored the places that they visited as well as mapping out their journeys using compass points.



In DT we have learnt how to safely measure, mark and saw wood. We then used this skill to create a moving vehicle.



In science we have learnt about plants.
What conditions they need to survive including photosynthesis, the process of taking in carbon dioxide, water and light and then converting it into oxygen and

glucose. We finished our unit by exploring the life cycle of a plant.



Well, done Year 2 for another wonderful term! You are wonderful learners and great fun to spend time with. You continue to make us all proud!



Geography

Our topic this half term has been "Extreme Earth"! We have enjoyed learning about earthquakes, volcanoes, tsunamis and the different layers of the Earth.

World Book Day

We had an amazing day celebrating our love for reading! We got to show off our costumes in the parade, chill out in the library and go to the book café to read and have a snack!



English

In DT, we have been learning how to make different mechanisms. We have then used our new skills to add a linkage and lever into a moving book!

In English, we really enjoyed writing a persuasive speech and a job description! We have used lots of sentence structures and learnt how to organise our writing for different genres.



French

We have been learning the French for:

- Farm animals
- Pets
- Adjectives that describe our pets.
- Prepositional phrases

We have also found our love for BINGO! We like to play this game when we learn new words!

Science


In Science, we have been looking at what plants need to do to service. We have learnt about seed dispersal, germination, pollination, water transportation and the parts of a flowering plant!



This half term we have loved our writing unit based on Hope Jones, a pollution activist! But we haven't actually done much writing... That's because we have been analysing, planning, drafting and collaborating to create our own blogs on the iPads! We loved using diary features, amazing descriptions, emojis and a range of high-level writing features to type our blogs. Check out Purple Mash to see what we wrote about!

As part of our My Voice Matters programme, we also got to visit forest school!

In Maths this half term we have focussed on fractions. We have used concrete, pictorial and abstract methods to explore how to make unit fractions, equivalent fractions and using this knowledge to build our understanding linked to shapes and amounts.



In RE we have been focussing on what happened after Jesus' death. Pentecost is a really special time for Christians and the children have been digging deeper into why this is the case. We have loved exploring what happened to the disciples and how the Christian church became so popular. We also got to visit Rev Jen at church to hear about how Christians understand and celebrate Pentecost.







In Geography this half term we have been studying climate change and pollution. We loved finding out about how this not only affects our world but our local area too. We also learned about Greta Thunberg and created our own speeches to world leaders to MAKE A CHANGE!

In DT we have been looking at gears and levers. We used our Geography unit on climate change to explore, plan and create our own posters with moving pictures!

In PE this half term we have focussed on dance! We have loved working with different dance teachers and different types of music to create individual and group dances!









Another super busy half term with our mathematical learning in Year 6! We have delved into our understanding of decimals, learning how to confidently add and subtract, among other aspects. We have expanded on this learning by looking at fractions, decimals and percentages. We have looked at equivalents, as well as missing percentages of amounts and solved multi-step problems involving the above.



This half term in RE we have looked at Salvation. We have unpicked the Easter story and what it means for Christians, as well as how Christians believe that death is not the end. We have learnt that Christians believe Jesus calls them to sacrifice their own needs to the needs of others, and how some are prepared to die for others and for their faith.



Spring 2

Year 6



Our science topic for Spring 2 has been 'light'. We have looked at and learnt that light travels in straight lines, as well as exploring reflection and how it ca be used to help see. We have looked at shadows and conducted investigations into how shadows can change

Year 6 have shown their wonderfully creative sides throughout our writing this half term. We have spent time analysing and understanding what makes a good adventure narrative, and how we can integrate dialogue to show characterization and move the story on. The children then wrote their own adventure narratives based on a river of their choosing.. All of their writing had me engaged and excited! We have just finished the half term off by writing persuasive letters using a video stimulus 'Little Freak'. We have tried to persuade the boy's dad to let him lead a normal life!





Our geography topic this half term has had us looking at river! We began our learning with looking at how a river starts and the journey it takes as it makes it way to the seas/oceans. We looked at our local area and even visited the River Calder one afternoon to find the features of the river, as well as, sadly, pollution that has found its way to the banks of the river. The children were brilliant with their geographical understanding of the river and we have since used the information we have learnt back in school.

have looked at 'a weekend with friends', learning ,lots of new verbs and nouns to put into questions linked to sleepovers and activities with friends!



For PSHCE this half term, we looked at our

rights and responsibilities. We have looked at and

debated two sides to every story, as well as show-

ing an understanding of the legal age of social

media sites, and discussing why some people

don't always tell the truth online.

We have loved been able to create our own routines with friends and we have looked at lots of different styles of dance, including country!



Our PE this half term has been dance!





This half term, Year 6 have been looking at creating super fun fairground rides! We first looked at how various rides work, involving electrical circuits and mechanisms before designing and creating our own fairground rides. The children have shown great teamwork, communication and problem-solving!
